Recent Monitoring Visits

Two Governors joined Mr. O'Grady and the staff at the first staff training day of the year in September. The New School Curriculum was discussed and each teacher indicated the areas their class would cover. Governors were given a tour of the new building work.



One Governor visited the school during the visit of the Italian teachers.

The Governor joined Oak Class with their lesson and chatted to the Italian Headteacher about differences between how children are taught in Italy and the United Kingdom.

One Governor visited the school regarding drafting the new E-safety Policy. Interviews were conducted with members of the Pupil Parliament from years 1 to 6 on their experiences of Internet usage and perceptions of online safety. The School's E-safety Policy is being updated in line with current requirements.



Two Governors met with Mr. O'Grady and the Clerk to the Governing Body. Their focus was to find ways to make the Governing Body stronger and more strategic.

One of the current hot topics in education is whether schools should convert to Academies. We are aware that local schools have moved towards Academy status and we regularly discuss whether it would be in the best interests of West Horndon Primary to convert to an Academy. We have organised a training session in March to find out more about Academies and their benefits. At present we think that the School should stay as it is, but we will keep this decision under review – rest assured that no final decision would be taken without consulting parents first.



West Horndon Primary School – Committee Reports



Curriculum and Achievement Committee

This term the Curriculum and Achievement Committee reviewed school admissions, noting that the school was now full.

The committee noted that feedback from the recent survey of parents was positive with 100% of responses stating that they would recommend the school on Parent View.

Children's use of social media was discussed. This is in the School Improvement Plan. The school does not condone underage use of social media, but informs children how they can keep safe online. The school uses a child-friendly video to highlight the dangers.

Governors received an update on the implementation of the new National Curriculum. Expectations have been raised with children at an earlier stage of Key Stage 2 meeting curriculum content that was previously encountered at a later stage in Key Stage 2. Children in Year 2 and Year 6 continue to use the former curriculum and will be assessed on this. Other year groups using the new curriculum will be assessed using a new method, the details of which are yet to be confirmed by the Government.

The committee also reviewed the attendance figures and a new target of 96.5% for 2014/2015 was agreed.

Finance, Premise and Personnel Committee

The Finance, Premises and Personnel Committee continues to devote its attention to ensuring that school resources are used in the most efficient and effective manner.

The cost of building consultancy services are presently being studied with the aim of securing a more responsive service at a more competitive price.

All building work has been completed and the new kitchen is being used to provide meals 'in house' for as many children who want them. As we previously reported all KS1 children can have a free school meal if they choose. Many of the KS2 children are also choosing to have a hot meal.

This has been built into the School budget plan.
