# School day: settling in and curriculum

## School hours

Our school day starts at 8.45am and ends at 3.30pm.

## Uniform

Our school uniform consists of black bottoms, red polo shirts and red sweatshirts or cardigans with our school logo. On PE days children wear their PE kit to school.

#### School meals

Lunchtime is one of the best bits of the day at West Horndon. Our menu is inclusive, delicious and nutritious. Children have the choice of booking a school meal or bringing a healthy packed lunch from home.

#### Free school meals

For children in Reception to Year 2, the government provides free school meals. Children in Year 3 and above may be entitled if your family receive certain benefits. Find out more from Essex County Council.

## A bespoke curriculum to make learning irresistible

Our curriculum meets all requirements of the National Curriculum, brought to life through meaningful, engaging, practical, playful learning layers.

The curriculum is divided into three stages

- 1. Early Years Foundation Stage: from ages 0-5.
- 2. Key Stage 1: from ages 5-7.
- 3. Key Stage 2: from ages 7-11.

## Challenging and inspiring children

Depth of knowledge is the ultimate goal for our children. Through techniques like spaced repetition, interleaving and regular retrieval of previously learned content we increase knowledge storage and retrieval, resulting in long-term mastery of concepts and skills.

## Commando Joe's

This is top secret, but Commando Joe's is a unique character education curriculum designed to develop character traits and values. Children take on enjoyable, relevant missions that involve cooperating and learning with their peers to grow skills that support them in and out of school.

## Enhanced provision for speech and language

Alongside our mainstream classes we have an enhanced provision for speech and language. This class is usually for children with an EHCP who would benefit from focused teaching and speech and language therapy alongside careful integration with their mainstream peers. ## 50 Things

Our learners deserve a broad range of experiences during their learning journey with us, so we developed our '50 Things' to detail the enhanced curriculum entitlement for children at West Horndon. ## Active movement and outdoor learning

Being outdoors makes us happy and healthy

Alongside PE lessons and swimming, we take part in the daily mile. Our Forest School sessions help children navigate real situations where they can build confidence and independence. We have our own specialist sports coach and we take part in as many sporting events as we can.

### **OPAL - Outdoor Play and Learning**

The quality of play matters. OPAL has helped us transform lunchtimes into a creative, collaborative, active and imaginative social experience. Outdoor play is treated as a curricular area, planned for, resourced and staffed.

## First Class Friday

As part of our broad curriculum offer on Friday afternoons our children take part in First Class Friday. In mixed aged groups they work with a different adult each half term, learning new skills, building new relationships and having new experiences. Recent activities have included:

- Science Magic.


## **Getting involved**
