Dear Parents and Carers,

As you may be aware several classes are planning exciting and valuable school trips at the moment. Please be aware that although we ask for a voluntary contributions if we do not receive contributions from all parents the trip may not be viable and may not go ahead. Furthermore, it may mean we are unable to plan further school visits in the future. We cannot afford to continue to subsidise visits where not enough contributions are received.



We would like to clarify to parents the procedure for setting homework. In general, teachers will place details of homework on the class webpage on a Friday. This may not be updated every week if the nature of the homework in ongoing. Teachers will also 'flag' homework on ClassDojo as appropriate. Year 5 and 6 are expected to take more personal responsibility as we prepare them for the next stage in their education. We will expect them to record their homework in their homework diary and manage their own deadlines (with parental support).

From time to time children may get additional homework, either as a group or an individual according to events in school (eg, following an intervention group, challenges set by the headteacher, as part of forest schools etc) or their individual needs. We will do our best to make parents aware of this as and when it occurs.
